Our AWANA Team, led by Lisa Cervantes, has spent the summer brainstorming and planning how we can safely serve our children and families while limiting exposure to the Covid-19 virus. They have researched the Oregon Health Authority guidelines for youth and children's gatherings and have developed an AWANA program that follows OHA guidelines and provides for a wonderful Bible and worship experience for kids.

There is not enough space to fully describe the program here, but in short, parents will drop children off and we will limit the number of adults entering the facility. Sparks (K-2nd grade) and TnT (3rd-5th grade) will meet on alternating weeks and groups of 10 will be maintained throughout the entire season in order to limit exposure. 


DRIVE-IN SERVICES I




