FROZEN FOOD MINISTRY

I received the diagnosis of breast cancer in October 2004. Facing the holidays and family seemed impossible while worrying about what this diagnosis would do to our family with young daughters. Suddenly, dreams of Holiday cheer and worries about how to afford Christmas gifts went out the door. Instead, worry and anxiety set in along with the practical side of treatment and doctor appointments. Normal life was pushed aside to deal with this diagnosis.

One shining light in the midst of this season in my life was that I did not go through this alone. I had Jesus to comfort me with His Words and I had His church to show me love in tangible ways.

When the cancer was removed, I had church family praying for me. They sent me cards of encouragement and listened to me and my concerns. The most unforgettable yet practical help they did for me was to bring us meals. At a time of crisis, any meal is appreciated but especially one that was delivered by a fellow church member who would pray with us or, on certain hard days, deliver the meal and go.

We want to be a church that helps one another. Meal trains are often accomplished through a member's Life Group or Bible Study. Women's Ministry gets to assist with families with new babies. But what about those church members that are no longer linked into either of these groups due to inability to travel, chronic illness, or age? Our church is starting a ministry called Frozen Meals. We will deliver meals to those who need to feel Jesus' love in this tangible and practical way. We have those who will deliver the meals in place.
